There will be 200 singers from choirs throughout the North East. The core choirs are Ryton Choral Society and Bishopwearmouth Choral Society who will provide 100 voices. There will not be an audience for the performance because the NRFH is limited to 200 persons. The choirs will be augmented by professional singers who will also sing the solo roles. Christopher Wood will be in attendance.

Registration

There will be 2 tables near the entrance of the NRF Hall at which singers will need to register. There will be a table for Ryton, Bishopwearmouth and Newcastle Choral Society singers and a second table for all others. Your name will be listed by voice and alphabetically by surname in that list. Parking and refreshment vouchers will also be available here (see below).

Refreshment

No refreshment will be provided. However, at the workshop you can collect a 10% discount card to be used at The Sage's refreshment outlets. A short walk across the Millennium Bridge will bring you to Newcastle Quayside where there are numerous outlets for lunch – or, of course, you can bring your own food and consume it within The Sage.

Parking

If you are driving to the event a £4 parking permit will be available for you to collect. This can only be used in the upper car park that is designated for Sage users. This is how it works! On entering the car park you take a ticket as normal; when you attend the workshop you will be given a different ticket; you then can get rid of the ticket you took from the machine on entering the car park; when you leave, you present the new ticket to the pay machine and you will be charged £4 (as opposed to the hourly rate you would have been charged).


Timing of the day

Seating plan

Tenors and basses are rather overwhelmingly outnumbered – but I'm sure we will hold our own! So the men will be placed centrally and to the front. Cards marked T and B will be placed on the seats reserved for male voices. The ladies will surround them – sopranos to the conductor's left as he faces the choir, altos to the right. There will *not* be lots of cards with S and A on them – so, ladies, please fill up the seats appropriately without leaving any gaps.
